Ames Yavuz Singapore is pleased to present *Indoor Weather*, a solo exhibition by Filipino-artist Yasmin Sison. Continuing a three-decade exploration of interior spaces, *Indoor Weather* brings together a new series of paintings, works on paper, and collages that examine the relationship between containment, memory, domesticity and femininity.

Central to the exhibition are Sison's constructed interiors: miniature, box-like environments developed over time in the studio alongside flowers gathered during her daily walks. These parallel acts of collecting and building converge in compositions where time appears suspended, often in the quiet light of late afternoon or early evening.

While the painted spaces reference the dollhouse—contained, scaled, and controlled—the works themselves are large and immersive. This tension between intimacy and bodily encounter invites viewers into environments that are at once carefully composed and quietly overwhelming. Within these interiors, furniture and detritus anchor the space, while flowers—once encountered outdoors—are relocated, arranged, and held under artificial light. In doing so, Sison reflects on increasingly mediated experiences of the natural world, where encounters are framed, interiorised, and distanced. By juxtaposing flowers and dollhouses, objects of societally imbued and associated femininity and domesticity, Sison also forms both an existential and a feminist critique of the situations outside. Plants that were once objects of the exterior recontextualise the interior space by reorganising the tools within the home at their disposal.

The artist's collage works draw from vintage flower arrangement manuals, interrupting inherited systems of order with gestures of abstraction and play. These works question how beauty is taught, composed, and disciplined, while allowing improvisation to emerge within structured frameworks. Extending this inquiry materially, Sison's sculptural assemblages—comprised of doll furniture bound, stacked, and compressed—suggest both preservation and constraint, evoking states of emotional compression, precarity, and isolation.

Across the exhibition, arrangement operates as both method and subject. Sison reflects on the impulse to organise and contain as a means of seeking stability, particularly in moments of uncertainty. Yet within these controlled environments, subtle disruptions persist: shadows extend beyond their sources, colour presses against structure, and flowers carry with them the memory of open space. These gestures point to an enduring longing for connection, permeability, and shared experience.

Sison explores a pensive girlhood that persists in spite of the external affronts that trouble the enclosed space. Rather than rejecting order, *Indoor Weather* gently reconfigures it from within—proposing new ways of inhabiting and reshaping the systems that define how we see, feel, and relate to the world and one another.

About the Artist

Yasmin Sison's (b. 1972, Philippines) works linger dreamily within the tranquillity and the oddities of the everyday. Her compositions render in a combination of both airy and vibrant hues seek to draw out the fleeting and complex emotions buried in the crevices of memory, childhood, and the fragile landscapes of everyday life.

A graduate of the University of the Philippines Diliman in both Humanities and Fine Arts, she is known for intimate, psychologically charged paintings that blur the boundaries between autobiographical narrative and staged fiction.

Working primarily in painting, Sison often depicts children, family members, and domestic scenes rendered with photographic precision yet imbued with dreamlike ambiguity. Across her practice, themes of play, masquerade, and transformation appear repeatedly, suggesting the ways identity and memory are performed, remembered, and reshaped over time.

In her recent works, Sison continues to draw from personal and familial imagery—capturing fleeting moments and quiet rituals that hold emotional weight. These paintings operate like visual records of lived experience, where tenderness and turbulence coexist, reflecting the shifting currents of time, memory, and personal history.

A recipient of the Cultural Center of the Philippines Thirteen Artists Award in 2006, Sison has exhibited widely across Southeast Asia and internationally, and remains a significant voice in contemporary Philippine painting.
